Transportation

The Southern Sun Waterfront and Garden Court East Boulevard hotels offer a prearranged shuttle service from the airport and for more information see hotel information (pp). **Transportation from the two hotels to the conference venue is provided in the morning and evening.**

Cape Town International Airport

Taxi

There are three types of taxis in Cape Town- metered, minibus, and rikki taxis

Metered Taxis

Metered taxis are often difficult to hail on the street but rides may be arranged by phone or taxi stand. By taxi the duration from the airport to Cape Town centre is about 20 minutes depending upon traffic and cost approximately R200.

Minibus Taxis

Minibus taxis are used frequently by residents and the vehicles may make frequent stops to pick up other passengers and may not be in the best condition. The taxi fares are unregulated but costs can range from R5-R20. One may hail a driver from the street.

Rikki Taxis

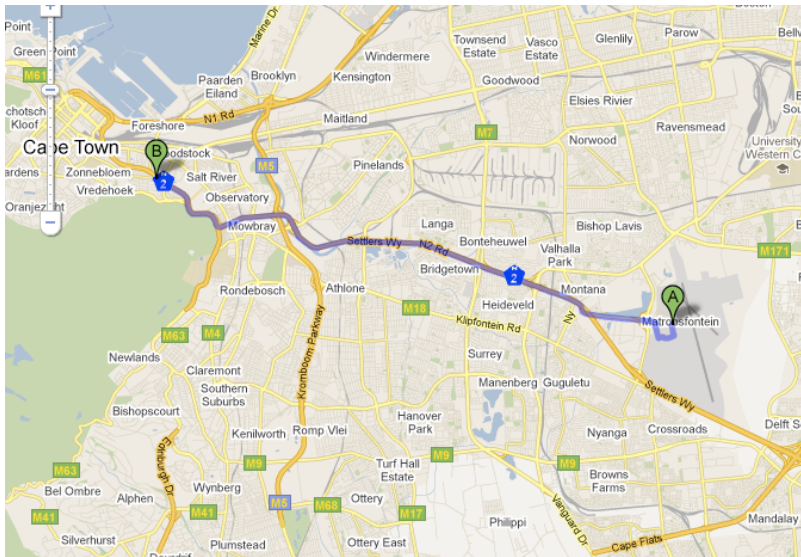
Rikkis are more affordable for short distances than metered taxis and safer than minibus taxis. To book a rikki, one may make a free phone call using one of the yellow telephones situated around the city. The cost of a private rikki is generally R50-R80 but one may share a rikki to make the ride cheaper. The price from the airport to the city center will be approximately R200, similar to the metered taxis. Rikkis run from 7 am- midnight on weekdays, 8 am- midnight on Saturdays, and 8 am-10 pm on Sundays. For more information go [here](#).

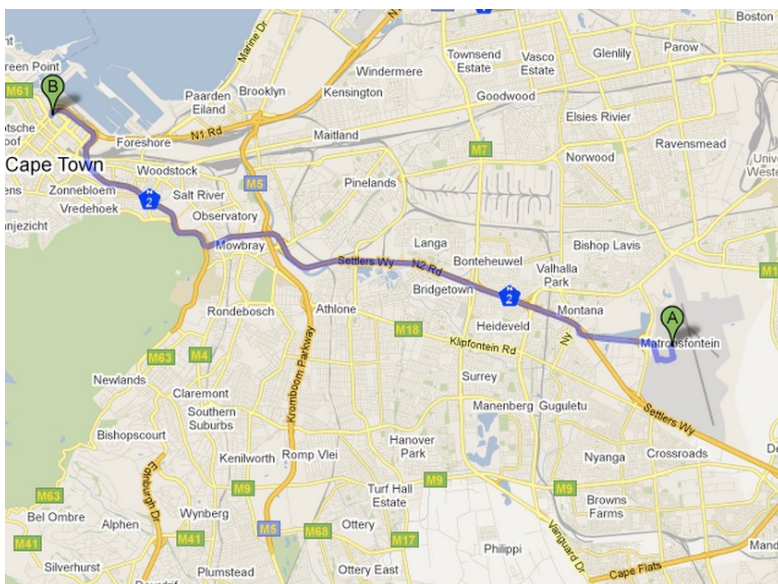

Directions and Map

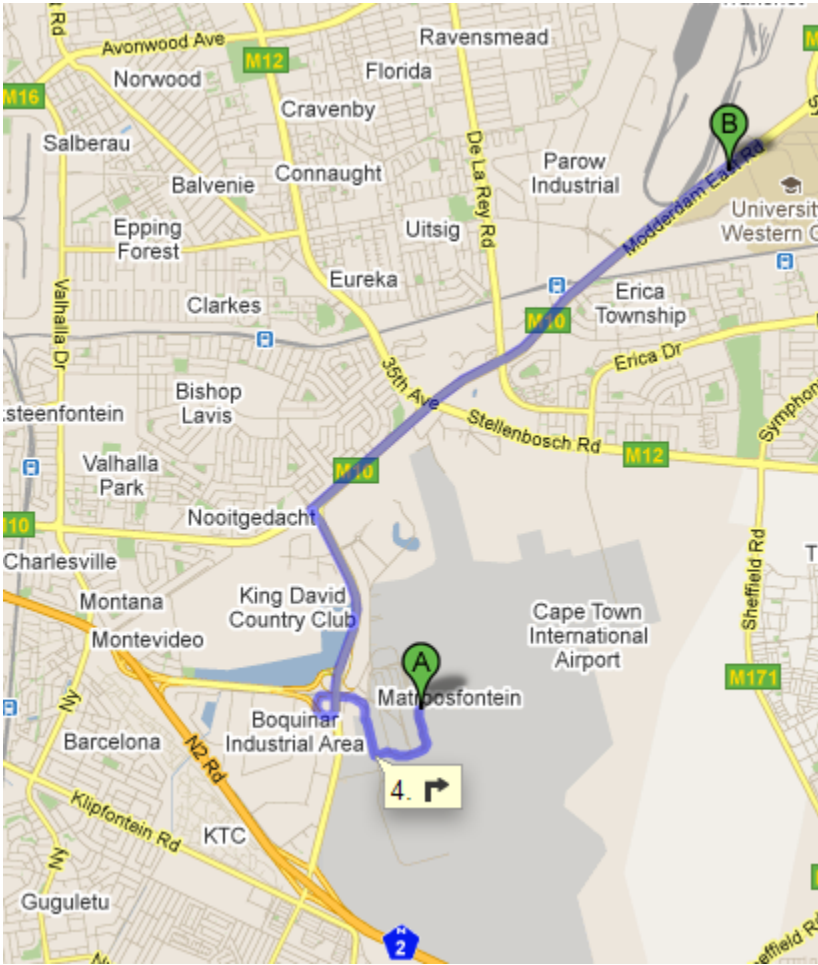
The airport is labeled as A and the **Garden Court Boulevard Hotel** is labeled as B in the map below. For driving directions from the airport to the hotel please go [here](#)

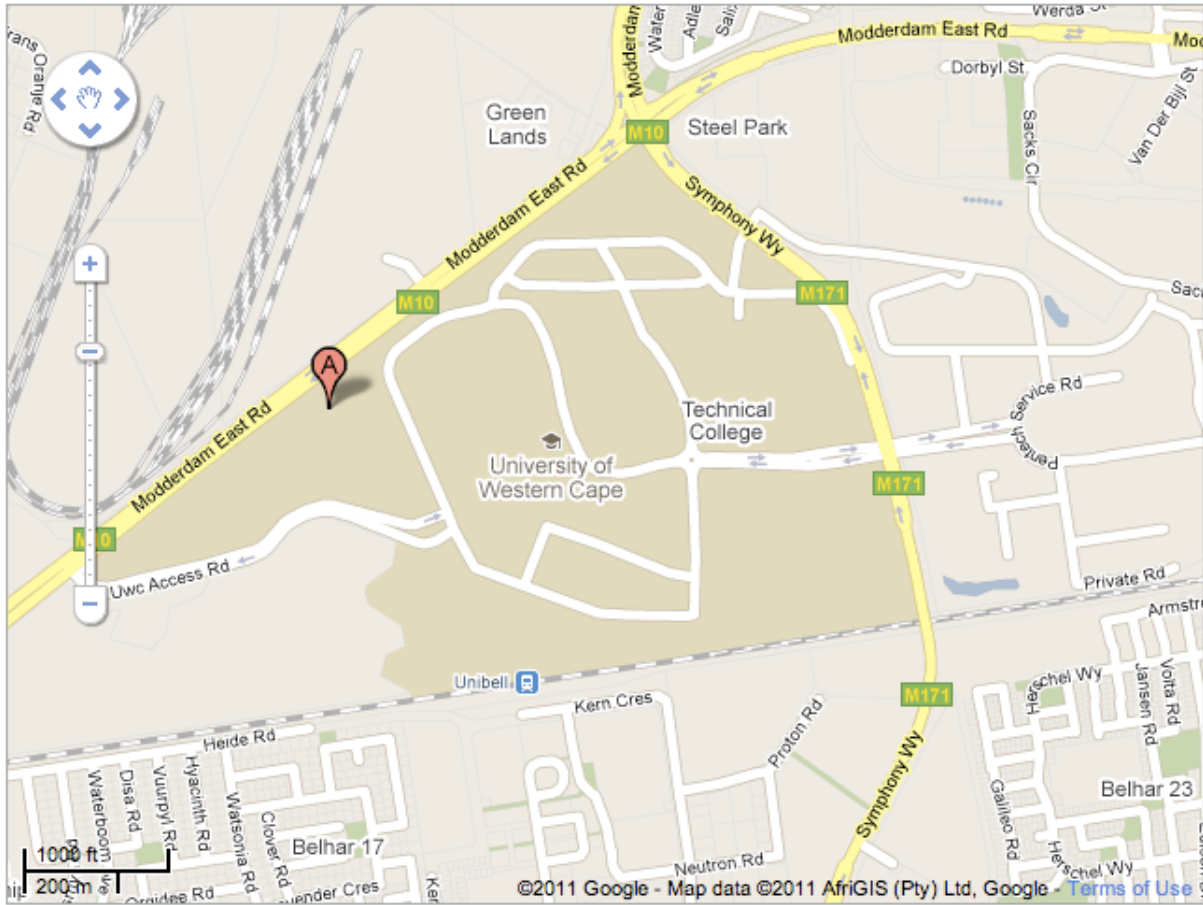

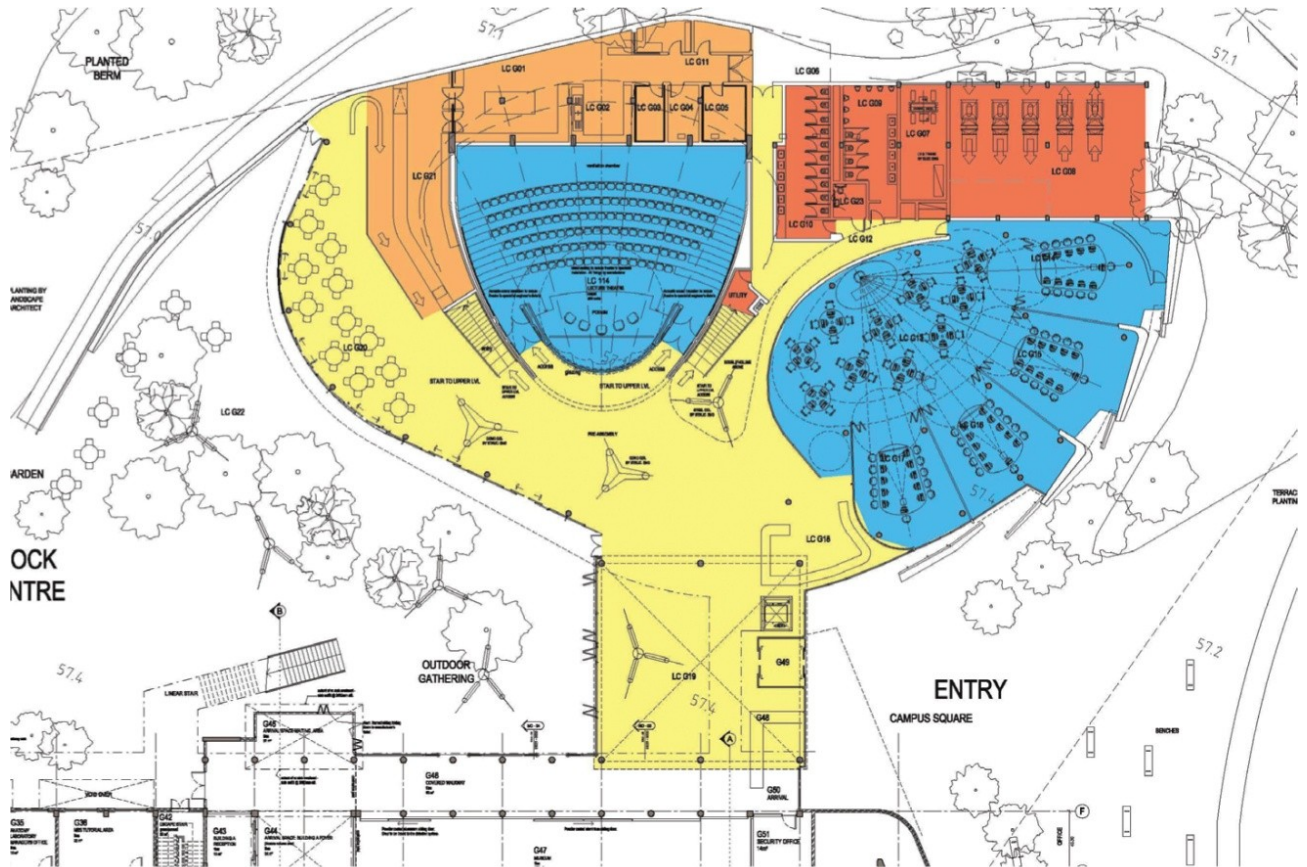

The final date for submitting your paper for consideration is 22 July 2011 – **one month after the last day of the conference**. This will guarantee that your paper is reviewed through our one way blind refereeing process.
